Conduct analysis and evaluation of intelligence holdings to determine changes in enemy capabilities, vulnerabilities, and probable courses of action. Conduct IPB using information from all sources.

HUMINT / Generalist Course

Joint HUMINT Analysis and Targeting Course (JHATC) – 2 weeks

This course is open to any Soldier with a TS who is serving in an MI unit or has a job related to HUMINT. There is an MTT available and it may be offered for in-state Annual Training.

HUMINT Officer Courses

Source Operations Course (SOC) – 7 weeks

Joint HUMINT Officer Course (JHOC) – 4 weeks

Joint Interrogator Management Course (JIMC) – 3 weeks

These courses are required for an O3 to gain the 35F identifier, but they are also open to enlisted graduates of the 35M10 course.

Performs initial analysis to establish target identification and operational patterns; identifies, reports, and maintains Signals Intelligence (SIGINT) and Electronic Order of Battle (EOB) information in support of OB; uses technical references to analyze communications and non-communications information. Operate automated data processing (ADP) equipment for SIGINT collection, processing and reporting. Maintain analytical working aids and databases to support target collection, identification, and location. Perform operator maintenance on surveillance systems, organic communications equipment, light wheeled vehicles and power sources. Assists in the emplacement, camouflage, and recovery of surveillance systems and/or associated equipment. Prepare technical and tactical intelligence reporting.

Contesting Bogus Collections

Some people think they need to pay off all of their debts before they put in for a clearance, even if the debt is dubious. Not true. You just need to show you have things under control. Sometimes this means a payment plan. But other times, it means documenting that the claim is fraudulent or unfounded.



SF86 FAQ

Q: I used to do drugs. Should I admit to that?

A: Yes. The clearance process is not a perfection contest. The purpose of the investigation is to determine whether you could be blackmailed by a hostile entity and coerced into turning over classified information. If a crime is part of your past and you readily admit to it, then it gives an adversary very little leverage over you. If you have forms that are inconsistent and it looks like you're hiding something, then you could lose your shot at a clearance during the investigation or a subsequent polygraph test. Learn more [here](#).

Q: I have Facebook friends who are foreign. Do I need to list them as foreign contacts?

A: It depends. The standard for a relationship is one that is "close and continuing" or one in which you are "bound by affection or duty." If the contact is your live-in girlfriend's father or a business partner, then you must list that person. If the contact is a foreign exchange student who took a class with you in 2008 and never spoke to you after returning to Nepal, then no. If you're really unsure whether the person qualifies, then err on the side of reporting. Learn more [here](#).

Q: I think I did this already. Do I have to do it again?

A: Yes. But if you kept a copy of your last version, it should go much faster.

Q: I have some debt. Can I still get a clearance?

A: Yes, but you have to demonstrate that you're working on it. If you were the victim of fraud, start [here](#). If you need to show a good-faith effort on legitimate debt, start [here](#).



Legitimate Debt or Collections

People carry all kinds of debt – mortgages, car notes, student loans, etc. For the most part, debt alone isn't a problem if you're applying for a security clearance. However, ***debt is a problem if it's out of control.***

If you get a TS clearance, you'll have access to information that foreign governments would pay large amounts of money for. Several of the most infamous traitors in US history were paid large sums of money by the Soviet Union. If you appear to be in over your head, you'll seem vulnerable to bribery.

If you are behind in your debt payments, try [this](#) resource or [this](#) one. For clearance purposes, the important part is knowing exactly what all of your debts are and having a plan in place to address them.

If you're being pursued by creditors for money you don't owe, [try this](#) to resolve the matter.



If they are discovered by law enforcement, you could be prosecuted. If they are found by the enemy, you could be blackmailed.

One of the mandatory questions on a Suitability Polygraph is “have you ever committed a serious crime?”
The natural question is “*how serious is serious?*” Not a question you want to be asking during the interview.

The general test is this:

If you were caught, could you have gone to jail?

If the answer is YES, then this is a serious crime.
You may be denied a clearance even if you are forthcoming.

If the answer is NO, then you may be granted a clearance if your reporting is open and consistent.







Foreign Language Testing and Training

Language Training:

Some positions require that you speak a foreign language. Before they can perform their duties, [Cryptologic Linguists \(35P\)](#) must demonstrate proficiency in their assigned language. Other specialties like [HUMINT Collectors \(35M\)](#) can get language training if funds are available and the Soldier qualifies. ***These courses last about a year and are full-time*** in Monterey, California. Orders to the Defense Language Institute (DLI) are generally considered highly desirable. The MDARNG's ability to fund these courses may be limited, but they are worth working for.

If you have not achieved proficiency in a foreign language and would like to be eligible for classes at DLI, you should take the [DLAB](#) and shoot for a score of 115 to maximize your chances.

If you already have limited proficiency in a [critical language](#), you can test in it (details at right) and qualify for refresher training. For more information on this option, contact the [Transition Project Officer](#).

Language Testing:

The Defense Language Proficiency Test (DLPT) measures how well you understand a foreign language. Unless you already speak the foreign language, you will not take this test right away.

Reading and Listening passages are given in the foreign language and you answer questions about them in English. Each section is scored on a 0-3 scale. 2/2 is considered proficient.

Proficiency will make you eligible for bonus pay if your language is assigned to you or deemed critical. Learn more about [critical languages](#) here.

[The Defense Language Aptitude Battery \(DLAB\)](#) tests your ability to learn a foreign language. It is not a foreign language test, but you can learn about it [here](#).

Critical Languages

What is “critical” exactly?

The Army designates a language as “critical” when it has a shortage of Soldiers who speak a language that is needed by the Army. Doing so allows more funding to be routed to bonuses, refresher courses, and contracts that fill the need.

Which languages are critical?

The designation of a language as “critical” changes year to year. You can check the most current ALARACT here:

Speaking a critical language has these advantages:

1. Annual Refresher Training

Five weeks on orders even if the language does not relate to your ARNG job

2. Foreign Language Proficiency Bonus (FLPB)

Up to \$200-\$400/month per language depending on your proficiency score. No more than \$1000 total bonus per month.

3. Civilian Job Opportunities

There are always openings in Maryland for speakers of these languages

Defense Language Aptitude Battery (DLAB)

The **Defense Language Aptitude Battery (DLAB)** tests your ability to learn a foreign language. You do not need to speak any particular foreign language to take the DLAB. However, it helps to have a basic grasp of parts of speech, suffixes, and word order patterns.

The average score on the DLAB is 100. A 95 is currently required to qualify for the language-related specialties [HUMINT \(35M\)](#). To be a [linguist \(35P\)](#), you will usually need a 105 or 115. This is because Category I and II languages are generally low-demand. If you can qualify to learn a Category III or IV language, you are much more likely to be selected.

Here are examples of minimum scores needed for certain languages:

Category I (95+): French, Spanish

Category II (100+): German, Indonesian

Category III (105+): Persian, Russian, Tagalog

Category IV (115+): Arabic, Chinese, Korean

Note: [The Defense Language Proficiency Test \(DLPT\)](#) is an entirely different test. Once you have learned a language, the DLPT measures how well you understand that language. Your Reading and Listening are scored separately on a 0-3 scale. 2/2 is considered proficient. For more information, talk to the [Transition Project Officer](#).

Chapter 2 Physical (PULHES)

The medical review board assigns a “1” through “4” for each of the following categories. A “3” or “4” generally disqualifies a Soldier while “2” may or may not depending on the category and MOS requirements.

- P – Physical capacity and stamina (e.g. heart issues)
- U – Upper body
- L – Lower body
- H – Hearing
- E – Eyes (e.g. you’re a “2” if you wear glasses)
- S – Psychiatric

You can find your PULHES score on your ERB in the marked area.

Functional Areas

Officers and NCOs who have already attained a basic branch may also train in a Functional Area (FA). This will allow the Soldier to promote into a billet of either his/her branch or his/her FA. It is particularly useful for NCOs who have completed ALC or officers who have completed CCC and are less able to changes their basic branches.

Below are examples of FAs that have openings in Maryland.

Information Operations (FA30)

An S7 conducts Inform and Influence Activities (IIA). The goal of these activities is to impact a foreign public's or enemy's understanding of the operational environment in order to change the enemy's behavior. Operations include leaflet drops, radio messages, and whisper campaigns. They can use truthful information to discredit enemy leadership, but can also support military deception (MILDEC).

The 110 IO BN is currently located in Laurel and will likely relocate to Annapolis.

Public Affairs (FA46)

The PAO releases accurate, honest, and timely information to the media and American public. They document the work of MDARNG units and make the public aware of the good work that those units are doing.

PA positions are available in multiple units, but the MPAD will be located at Camp Fretterd Military Reservation.

Information Systems (FA53)

The IS Manager oversees the installation and management of computers. He or she generally serves at the brigade level and above.

There will be a new opening for this position in Ruhl.



Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Will I qualify for a Top Secret security clearance?

Your suitability depends on your personal history and your willingness to be proactive. The typical show-stopper is debt, so check your collections status at www.annualcreditreport.com. You can also check the [SF86 FAQ](#) or use the security clearances [self-help guide](#) to get the ball rolling.

Q: Can I use the clearance outside the Army?

If you receive a TS clearance, you can use it in the civilian job market and chart a new career path.

Q: My MOS/AOC is going away. What does that mean for me and my [bonus](#)?

There are a lot of great questions that have been asked by Soldiers in this position. Answers can be found [here](#).

Q: I know what position I want in the new force structure. How do I move into that billet?

You should review the [requirements for the MOS](#) to make sure you qualify. Then express to your chain of command your desire to serve in that capacity and request a slot in the appropriate transition course. If the new job requires a higher security clearance, [get started](#) on that.

Q: I think I want to reclass to MI, but I'm not sure what all the options are?

Check out [this page](#) for questions about MI.

Q: I've requested course dates, but I have not been reserved for a spot. What can I do right now?

If your course requires a clearance you have not yet attained, check with the S2 shop to ensure nothing else is needed for your clearance. If you meet all the prerequisites, check with you chain of command and Readiness NCO.

Frequently Asked Questions – Intel MOS

Q: What are all of my choices for MI?

Compare them side by side here.

Q: I want to reclass to MI but I cannot commit to over a month at a time away from my civilian employer. Is that possible?

Yes. Most of the billets are associated with transition courses designed for the Reserve Component. Check out the transition process for HUMINT ([35M](#)), All-Source ([35F](#)), and CI ([35L](#)).

Q: I like MI, but I don't want a desk job. What MOS is right for me?

Linguists ([35P](#)) and Human Intelligence Collectors ([35M](#)) are often required to travel outside the wire to meet with sources, but the nature of the job will vary based on the operating environment.

FAQ – Displaced MOS

If you are an officer, click [here](#). These questions are from enlisted Soldiers.

Q: I want to request an Interstate Transfer (IST), but I have a bonus associated with my MOS. Can I keep my bonus if I stay with the same MOS?

Generally, yes. The exception would be if you move from a deployable unit to a non-deployable unit.

Q: If I switch to the Air National Guard or Army Reserve, will I keep my bonus?

That will depend on the policy of the gaining entity. The Army National Guard will claim a portion of your prorated bonus, but you may qualify for the same bonus in your new position.

Q: I am an NCO who recently got a bonus to extend in my MOS for 4 years, but after the transition my MOS will not exist in the MDARNG. Can I keep my bonus?

If you stay in the MDARNG in a TPU or deployable TPA, you will keep your bonus. If you request release before your contract is up, your bonus will be partially recuperated. If you have more than two years on your contract, you will need to reclass to stay in and keep your full bonus.

Q: My ETS is three years away, but my MOS will go away before then. If I am not qualified to reclass, will I be released or will I move to a billet for which I am unqualified?

You can occupy a billet for which you are unqualified for up to two years. If you will serve for at least two more years, you need to make a plan to find a new MOS.

FAQ – Displaced AOC

Q: I am a 2LT and recently graduated from BOLC. After the transition, my branch will not have positions in the MDARNG. How do I reclass if I am too junior to attend the Career Course?

It is difficult to reclass as an officer prior to attending the Career Course as a senior 1LT. You may have to move into a slot before you are officially qualified for it. For instance, you might share a slot with a Company XO and serve as the Deputy XO to a 1LT who is branch-qualified. You will learn from him or her, you will assist in management tasks not requiring the branch qualification, and you will eventually complete your branch qualification and take over. That's just one example of how things could go, but the MDARNG will not stop making use of its newly minted officers.
